### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

As required by Section 15(h)(3)(A)(ii) of the Small Business Act, the General Services Administration (GSA) provides a report on all prime contract procurements made during Fiscal Year (FY) 2018, not excluding any contract awarded. The information in this report was derived from the Federal Procurement Data System (FPDS) and includes procurements made for the Federal Government, including each of the funded 24 Chief Financial Officers (CFO) Act agencies. Based on this report, Federal Government contract expenditures totaled \$555 Billion during FY 2018. Other than small business expenditures totaled \$431 Billion. Small business expenditures totaled \$124 Billion. Government-wide dollars awarded to service-disabled veteranowned small businesses (SDVOSB) totaled \$23 Billion; Historically Underutilized Business Zones (HUBZone) small businesses totaled \$10 Billion; small disadvantaged businesses (SDB) totaled \$50 Billion; and women-owned small businesses (WOSB) totaled \$18 Billion.

Additionally, as required by Section 15(h)(3)(A)(ii), subcontracting data is being supplied. Based on this report, which is derived from the Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (eSRS), Federal Government subcontracting dollars awarded during FY 2018 totaled \$117 Billion. Dollars awarded to small business through subcontracting totaled \$81 Billion during FY 2018. Government-wide subcontracting dollars awarded to service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses (SDVOSB)

totaled \$5 Billion; Historically Underutilized Business Zones (HUBZone) small businesses totaled \$4 Billion; small disadvantaged businesses (SDB) totaled \$13 Billion; and women-owned small businesses (WOSB) totaled \$14 Billion.

## **Prime Contracts**

The first report provides prime contract awards without exclusions, as required by Section 15(h)(3)(A)(ii) of the Small Business Act. This report provides, for the Federal Government and each of the funded 24 Chief Financial Officers (CFO) Act Agencies, an accounting of the number and dollar amount of all prime contracts awarded during FY 2018 to—

#### Small business concerns--

- (I) in the aggregate;
- (II) through sole source contracts;
- (III) through competitions restricted to small business concerns; and
- (IV) through unrestricted competition;

### Small business concerns owned and controlled by service-disabled Veterans--

- (I) in the aggregate;
- (II) through sole source contracts;
- (III) through competitions restricted to small business concerns;
- (IV)through competitions restricted to small business concerns owned and controlled by service-disabled veterans; and
- (V) through unrestricted competition;

### Qualified HUBZone small business concerns--

- (I) in the aggregate;
- (II) through sole source contracts;
- (III) through competitions restricted to small business concerns;
- (IV) through competitions restricted to qualified HUBZone small business concerns;
- (V) through unrestricted competition where a price evaluation preference was used; and

(VI) through unrestricted competition where a price evaluation preference was not used;

## Small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals--

- (I) in the aggregate;
- (II) through sole source contracts;
- (III) through competitions restricted to small business concerns;
- (IV) through competitions restricted to small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals;
- (V) through unrestricted competition; and
- (VI) by reason of that concern's certification as a small business owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals;

## Small business concerns owned by an Indian tribe (as such term is defined in section 8(a)(13) [15 USC § 637(a)(13)]) other than an Alaska Native Corporation--

- (I) in the aggregate;
- (II) through sole source contracts;
- (III) through competitions restricted to small business concerns;
- (IV)through competitions restricted to small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals; and
- (V) through unrestricted competition;

## Small business concerns owned by a Native Hawaiian Organization--

- (I) in the aggregate;
- (II) through sole source contracts;
- (III) through competitions restricted to small business concerns:
- (IV) through competitions restricted to small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals; and
- (V) through unrestricted competition;

## Small business concerns owned by an Alaska Native Corporation--

- (I) in the aggregate;
- (II) through sole source contracts;
- (III) through competitions restricted to small business concerns;
- (IV)through competitions restricted to small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals; and
- (V) through unrestricted competition;

## Small business concerns owned and controlled by women--

- (I) in the aggregate;
- (II) through competitions restricted to small business concerns;
- (III) through competitions restricted using the authority under section 8(m)(2) [15 USC§ 637(m)(2)];
- (IV) through competitions restricted using the authority under section 8(m)(7) [15 USC § 637(m)(7)] and in which the waiver authority under section 8(m)(3) [15 USC § 637(m)(3)] was used; and
- (V) through unrestricted competition;

### Other Than Small Business concerns—

- (I) in the aggregate
- (II) each funded 24 Chief Financial Officers (CFO) Act Agencies

The attached excerpt from the FPDS Small Business Goaling Report Appendix outlines a list of goaling report exclusions.

## **Subcontracting**

As required by Section 15(h)(3)(A)(ii) of the Small Business Act, the second report provides for the Federal Government the dollar amount and the distribution of subcontracts awarded during FY 2018 with respect to the North American Industry Classification System to small business concerns, small business concerns owned and controlled by service-disabled veterans, qualified HUBZone small business concerns, small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals, and small business concerns owned and controlled by women. The Act requires the number of actions as it relates to subcontracting; however, this information is not captured in the Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (eSRS) and, therefore, is not provided.
