GENERAL BUILDING INFORMATION

Welcome to Martin Luther King, Jr. Federal Building (MLK). Designed by Architect Anthony Ten Eyck Brown, the MLK building was constructed in 1931-1933 to meet the growing needs of the U.S. Postal Service. In 1983, GSA purchased this building for \$5 million, and in 1988 the building became the first federal building in the United States to bear Reverend King's name.

The architecture of this seven-story massive-blocked structure is described as "starved classicism" and contains outstanding examples of Art Deco inspired ornamentation typical of 1930's architecture. During the recent renovations, pieces of the building's historic fabric were uncovered, preserved, and incorporated into the modernized areas.
